2021 Diocesan Audit and Financial Report and resolution to accept report and audit

Mengle, Metzer, Barr completed 2021 audit in August 2021

Net assets: increased by \$3 million (+12%) over the year

Actual performance: operating surplus of about \$59,000\dagger 2\% more in rev. and 1% less in expenses.

2008-2014: draws averaged 8.4%

2015-2021: draws averaged 4.6%

2021 draw: 3.4%

Recovering the losses experiences in 2008

Looking forward 2022-2025: draws will increase, apportionment is going down, transition expenses, and inflation but, still in good management ranges

# Apportionment:

Move toward 10% tithe

10% for first \$160,000 and maintain 3% cap/floor ◊ \$992,112 for 2023

Apportionment is half of income, other half from investments

Draw from investments and interest from loans◊~ \$1 mil.

Budget expenditures have decreased since 2009 and been flat for the last several years since 2017\( \rightarrow\) uptick over the next couple of years (2024: transition expenses and General Convention.

#### 2023 Budget:

Income/ expenses down 1% from 2022

Changes to Leadership Development: Change in Deaf Ministry (clergy staffing).

changes in Diocesan Dean structure

Governance: Increased expenses for the Bishop transition

Diocesan Staff: inflation increases and new half-time Transition officer

Program: ~893,000 (CDP and Mission grants, DFMS, Leadership)

Admin: ~1,128,000 (Gov., Staff, and office expenses)

Excludes: \$50,000 non-operation draw for post-retirement health benefits
